Performance Notes

Mozart: Go for a refined, elegant, "Mozartean" sound. The dynamic of forte should reflect brilliance more than mere volume.

Berlioz: Intonation is paramount, as is an almost classical purity of sound. Keep the vibrato narrow in order to blend well with the section while carefully following the dynamics indicated. Fingerings are simply a guideline.

Bartok: Play upper line only. Fingerings are optional and are written above and below notes when more than one fingering is suggested. The passage should be played energetically but not roughly. Special attention should be paid to dynamics, articulation, and slides (glissandi).

Brahms: Tone should be lush and warm but not overplayed, particularly in the mp and mf passages. Indicated fingerings are optional.

Beethoven: Tempo range for both excerpts can be 8th = 80 - 92. Play dolce 32nds with precise intonation with particular attention to Ab's, Bb's and Eb's which are frequently too sharp (you can always check them against an open string). Don't forget to make the pp contrast in the last full bar.

* Please note that rhythm and tempo are particularly important in all the above excerpts. I recommend using a metronome frequently to verify accuracy.


